

Lubrication Specialist

Lubrication Specialists, or Oilers are responsible for lubricating machinery, changing parts, or performing other routine machinery maintenance. Some tasks include dismantling machines and removing parts for repair, using hand tools, chain falls, jacks, cranes, or hoists and lubricating or applying adhesives or other materials to machines, machine parts, or other equipment according to specified procedures.

Other job titles include: Lubricator, Machine Repairer, Maintainer, Maintenance Craftsman, Maintenance Mechanic, Maintenance Technician (Maintenance Tech), Maintenance Worker, Oiler, Overhauler

Most occupations in this zone require training in vocational schools, related on-the-job experience, or an associate's degree.

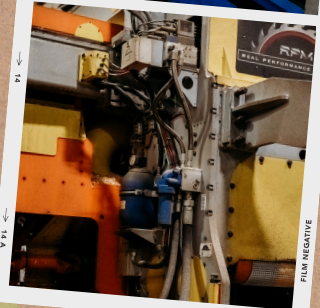
