A land management forester is skilled in designing and implementing forest management plans for government or private forestland owners. Management foresters make decisions that affect every phase of tree growth, from seedling to timber harvest. They must be well-versed in silviculture and know which practices to use to meet their employer's objectives for their property. They have general knowledge of soils, hydrology, wildlife, and all of the environmental benefits that come from healthy sustainable forests.


Other job titles include: Forest Practices Field Coordinator, Forester, Silviculturist.
