Land surveyors help determine property boundaries and provide data relevant to the shape, contour, gravitation, location, elevation or dimensions of land. In the forest industry, land surveyors plan and direct complex survey projects concerning boundary disputes, title claims, engineering surveys and right-of-way surveys. Land surveyors work both indoors and outdoors, and they may spend long periods of time walking over rough and uneven terrain in cold or hot weather.
